



A 6x6 grid puzzle. The grid is divided into four 3x3 quadrants by a vertical line between columns 3 and 4, and a horizontal line between rows 3 and 4. Numbers are placed in some cells, and paths are drawn in others. The paths are composed of straight line segments connecting adjacent cells (horizontally, vertically, or diagonally). The paths are as follows:

- Top-left quadrant: A path starts at (1,1), goes right to (2,1), then down to (2,2), then right to (3,2), then down to (3,3).
- Top-right quadrant: A path starts at (1,4), goes right to (2,4), then down to (2,5), then left to (1,5).
- Bottom-left quadrant: A path starts at (4,1), goes right to (5,1), then down to (5,2), then left to (4,2).
- Bottom-right quadrant: A path starts at (4,4), goes right to (5,4), then down to (5,5), then left to (4,5).
